# PD Dancer Portal

This web page contains all dancer information and resources including schedules, contact information, absence reporting, uniform, and more. Please check this often for updates. <u>All absences should be reported through this page.</u> Visit <u>http://nashvilleballet.com/pdportal</u> and use the password **PD2324** to access the Dancer Portal.

## **Orientation**

There will be a mandatory orientation for all Professional Division dancers (including returning dancers) on Saturday, August 12 at 4:30 p.m.

## **Attendance**

- Attend full class schedule as assigned.
- Regular or excessive absences may result in reassignment to the Academy.
- In the event of illness or absence, you must visit <u>http://nashvilleballet.com/pdportal</u> (password: PD2324) and submit an absence report.
- In the event you are running late for class, please call (615) 297-2966 x 910 to notify the front desk.

- Unreported absences are considered unexcused and will affect your eligibility for performances.
- Requests for days off for travel or auditioning must be made in advance (**2 weeks**) and in writing using the absence form provided. Please do not make travel arrangements prior to receiving written permission from the Professional Programs Manager or Interim School Manager.

# **Check-In Policy**

Please use your scan card to sign in at the beginning of the day. Your instructor will take roll and record your attendance in each individual class during the day as well.

# **Studio Policies**

- Dancers are expected to act in a professional, respectful and mature manner.
- No phones in the studio
- No chewing gum, food or drink will be permitted in the studios except capped bottled water.
- Please throw trash away promptly. Do not leave food or trash in the kitchen or hallways.
- No dance bags in the studio. (water, pointe shoes, and other essential items for their next class may be at the front of the room.)
- Dancers should refrain from bringing valuables to the studios. Nashville Ballet is not responsible for lost or stolen goods. Lockers are available in dressing room.
- If a dancer is late, they should wait politely at the door until they are acknowledged by the teacher and curtsy or bow before entering the studio (same if they exit and re-enter the studio for any reason). If the dancer is later than 15 min they will need to sit out and take notes.
- All dancers are expected to have a dance journal in their bag for notes, choreography, and other needs.
- Dancers must not lean on the barres in between combinations.
- Dancers must be aware of proper classroom etiquette and should avoid standing with hands on hips, arms crossed in front of their bodies, yawning, and making sure that they respectfully acknowledge and perform corrections when given.
- When working in groups, the dancers should have respect for their fellow classmates and teacher and not chatter on the sides of the room which causes a distraction.
- Dancers should not "mark" their arms in class as this will develop incorrect neuropathways and demonstrates poor work ethic. The dancers are still in the process of their training and must be mindful of this.
- Dancers are expected to be personally responsible for their class material and must prepare mentally prior to the beginning of class. This skill is an essential part of training to be a professional dancer.
- Inappropriate language is not acceptable in studio or hallways.
- Smoking is not permitted. Nashville Ballet is a smoke & vapor free campus.

# Additional Academy Classes:

To foster growth and increase studio time, PD dancers are encouraged to take additional Academy classes free of charge (this can include make up classes). Please see the PD portal for a list of Academy Classes.

# Winter And Spring Review Meetings

In the winter and in the spring PD dancers will have the opportunity to sign up for meetings with School of Nashville Ballet leadership to discuss their progress, follow up on goals set at the beginning of the semester, and discuss new goals and plans for their future careers. Details will be emailed in advance.

# **School Closings**

In the event of severe weather or loss of power, School of Nashville Ballet may cancel classes for a portion of the day or the entire day. Closing information will be posted on our web site, social pages, and announced via text alerts. Sign up for text alerts at https://www.remind.com/join/snbdppd

# Lost and Found

Items found will be kept for 3 weeks and then donated. The lost and found is locked at all times. If you would like to check for an item in the lost and found, please ask the front desk staff, and they will assist you.

# **Enrollment and Tuition Policies**

- Payment may be made by check or credit card. Payment plans are only available by approval of the Interim School Manager (<u>mzapp@nashvilleballet.com</u>) and through our automated system with a credit card.
- School of Nashville Ballet reserves the right to cancel a class due to lack of enrollment.
- Canceled classes will be prorated and refunded.
- Enrollment is for the entire year.
- **Tuition is non-refundable.** In the case of serious injury or illness, refunds may be considered on an individual basis. These refunds are <u>not guaranteed</u> and may be subject to a 25% administration fee.
- There is no proration for scheduling conflicts.
- Classes are not transferable to other dancers.
- Voluntary or involuntary withdrawal and missed classes are not considered eligible for refunds.
- Dancers with outstanding balances are not permitted to take classes until their accounts are current.
- Late payments will interrupt class participation.

# Dancer Accident/Injury Procedures

# **Minor Accidents/Injuries**

- Any injured dancer should report their injury(ies) to their teacher or the nearest faculty or staff member immediately. An Accident/Injury form must be turned in to the front desk, copies are available at the front desk.
- If deemed necessary, the teacher will administer First Aid.
- Minor accidents/Injuries will be reported to the School Administrative Director after class has ended. At this point a plan for the dancer to return to class/rehearsal will be put in place.

## Serious Accident/Injury

- A Faculty or staff member who receives first report of any serious accident or injury will report immediately to the Professional Programs Manager and School Administrative Director. They will then contact the parents of the dancer(s) involved immediately. At this point a plan for the dancer to return to class/rehearsal will be put in place.
- If an injury is serious enough, i.e. there is suspicion of broken bones, head or eye injuries, or excessive bleeding, that dancer will be transported to the nearest hospital or dealt with as advised by parents/guardians.
- All injuries need to be reported through the portal as well by the dancer.

In the event of severe injury, parents/guardians will be immediately contacted concurrently with a call requesting an ambulance.

## Injuries:

• In the case of injuries which preclude participation in class, we ask that dancers still attend class to observe and continue to learn from the instructor and peers. Dancers should take notes during the entirety of classes.

## Sickness:

Please help us maintain a healthy environment and reduce the spread of illness. Students with a fever greater than 100 degrees, who have experienced vomiting/diarrhea, or have another contagious illness should not attend class until they are symptom-free for at least 24 hours and are no longer contagious. Please communicate the student's sickness and anticipated absence(s) to us via the School of Nashville Ballet Absence Reporter which can be found on the Academy Portal. See our COVID-19 policies located on the Academy Portal.

# Health Policy:

- The school will monitor dancers' health as effectively as they can and promote a positive attitude towards weight, healthy eating habits and body image at all times
- All dancers keep to a healthy athletic weight to ensure that they are able to perform to their best ability
- Dancers who fall below their recommended norm may be putting their health at risk and therefore the school has the right to address the issue with effective and rapid intervention
- If the faculty of Nashville Ballet determines that a dancer's health is at risk:
  - The parent(s) and the dancer will be notified, and a private conference scheduled to discuss the issue and select appropriate action
  - If the dancer's condition does not improve, intervention and treatment from a trained professional will be strongly advised
  - If the dancer's health continues to decline, that individual will be unable to participate until the health is restored or will have their work load altered depending on the severity of each circumstance

# <u>Uniform</u>

# All Dancers are in black and pink/flesh tone for ALL company rehearsals.

Please see the two uniform options listed below.

## **Option One:**

- Black Nashville Ballet branded leotard or any simple black leotard
- Pink/Flesh colored convertible tights, either Capezio Style #9 in Theatrical Pink or any tights that match your flesh tone
- Practice tutus are required by October 1; we recommend <u>Tutu.com</u>, <u>Primadonna</u> or <u>Grishko</u>
- Pointe shoes upon teacher approval
- Ballet shoes in pink or flesh tone as available
- Black nylon/cotton blend socks for contemporary class

## **Option Two:**

- White Nashville Ballet branded leotard
- Grey convertible tights for ballet technique
- Black convertible tights or jazz pants for contemporary class
- White socks
- Black nylon/cotton blend socks for contemporary class
- White ballet shoes

Those that choose uniform option one are required to wear tights under their leotard and in their shoes for all classical classes. Appropriate tights (length and color) should be worn for all

rehearsals or alternate classes and will be determined by the artistic staff member running that class or rehearsal.


Warm-ups should be fitted and only worn when necessary. Hair should be neat and secured away from the face, and jewelry should be kept to a minimum. Please consider your pas de deux partner when wearing jewelry.

It is our expectation that you will wear professional work attire that is appropriate for your craft. We have board members, donors and guests in the building daily. Your attire should be considered neat, clean and professional should a visitor walk in at any time.


